By means of the mediation of glass walls, an aquarium enforces a material separation between the aquatic and the terrestrial world, as well as an ontological separation between humanity and what we refer to as Nature.

Its transparent character, which, at the same time, connects and separates, is the modernist expression of the relationship we have established with other species: animals removed from exotic or distant places, transformed into specimens and entities to be classified. An Enlightenment story and that much is clear.

Through a series of backstage tales, wet and at the same time opaque, involving lab archives, machines, microscopes, national aquariums, climate control, ocean infrastructures and real care, we will descend into an impossible love story which will reveal us as losers, but perhaps, also a little more of our animal side.
