Stefania Mariani is an actress, author, storyteller, clown, and theatre teacher.

She trained artistically at the Scuola Teatro Dimitri.

For over ten years, she has worked as an actress with various Italian and Swiss theatre companies, touring across Europe, Pakistan, India, and Chile.

She writes and performs theatre pieces for audiences of all ages, presented at numerous festivals and cultural events in Switzerland and abroad.

Passionate about experimenting with diverse artistic languages, her work ranges from theatrical storytelling and clowning to nature-based theatre experiences and poetic installations. She believes that theatre is a powerful form of human connection. She is especially drawn to the art of storytelling and to tales that reveal the extraordinary within the human experience. She collaborates with various cultural institutions in Italian-speaking Switzerland, including the Hermann Hesse Museum, the Monte Verità Foundation, the Museum of Peasant Civilisation in Stabio, and RSI (Swiss Radio and Television).

### **StagePhotography**

StagePhotography is an artistic collective founded in 2002 by Stefania Mariani and Michele Montalbetti, based in Ascona. Combining theatrical language with photographic expression, StagePhotography explores forms that highlight the potential and beauty of both human beings and nature.

Each project is developed in collaboration with external artists who share a poetic, artisan-like approach to creativity — one rooted in emotional exploration, the extraordinary power of wonder, and a vision of art as a meeting point between worlds.
