

Morphoses explores the topic of metamorphosis. Transformation, change, evolution and recycling become reflections, taking place to fill in a void.

The choreographers freely enter Ovid's fantastic universe to find out how his metamorphoses can echo our contemporary legends as inspirational resources: the giants, the flood, Pyrrha, Daphne, Narcissus, Achilles.

Morphoses reflects an economic, political and social context which is currently strained and in crisis.

Today, we can daily life filled with compromise and uncertainties, a weakened morality, an unstable climate.

#### Biography

Cie utilité publique based in Lausanne The company is based in Lausanne.

The core of Nicholas et Corinne Rochet's choreographic research is space, seen both as relation and transformation, as a place where a continuous adaptation process between construction and deconstruction takes place.

Their writing evolves through the flow between fluidity and depth of the gesture, between construction - deconstruction, anchoring and overflow. The choreography features types of play areas, where the audience is invited to enter, releasing them to undertake their own research for meaning and satisfy their need for abstraction.

Nicholas and Corinne Rochet are beneficiaries of a fixed duration state grant for the years 2018-2019-2019-2020.

In 2006, they won the European competition - AEROWAWAWAWES GRAPHY. In 2007, they were awarded the "Awakening Award" from the Vaud Foundation for Culture.

Their shows have been performed in Switzerland, France, England, Russia, Italy, Ireland, Romania and Portugal in renowned theatres or international festivals such as, among others, ARSENIC - Centre of contemporary scenic arts and Théâtre de l'Octogone in Lausanne (CH), Theaterspektakel, Tanzhaus and Rote Fabrick in Zurich (CH), Bern's dampfzentrale (CH), London's ROBIN HOWARD THEATRE (GB), the CULTURAL CENTRE OF BELEM in Lisbon (PT) or the OPERAESTATE FESTIVAL VENETO of Bassano del Grappa (IT).
